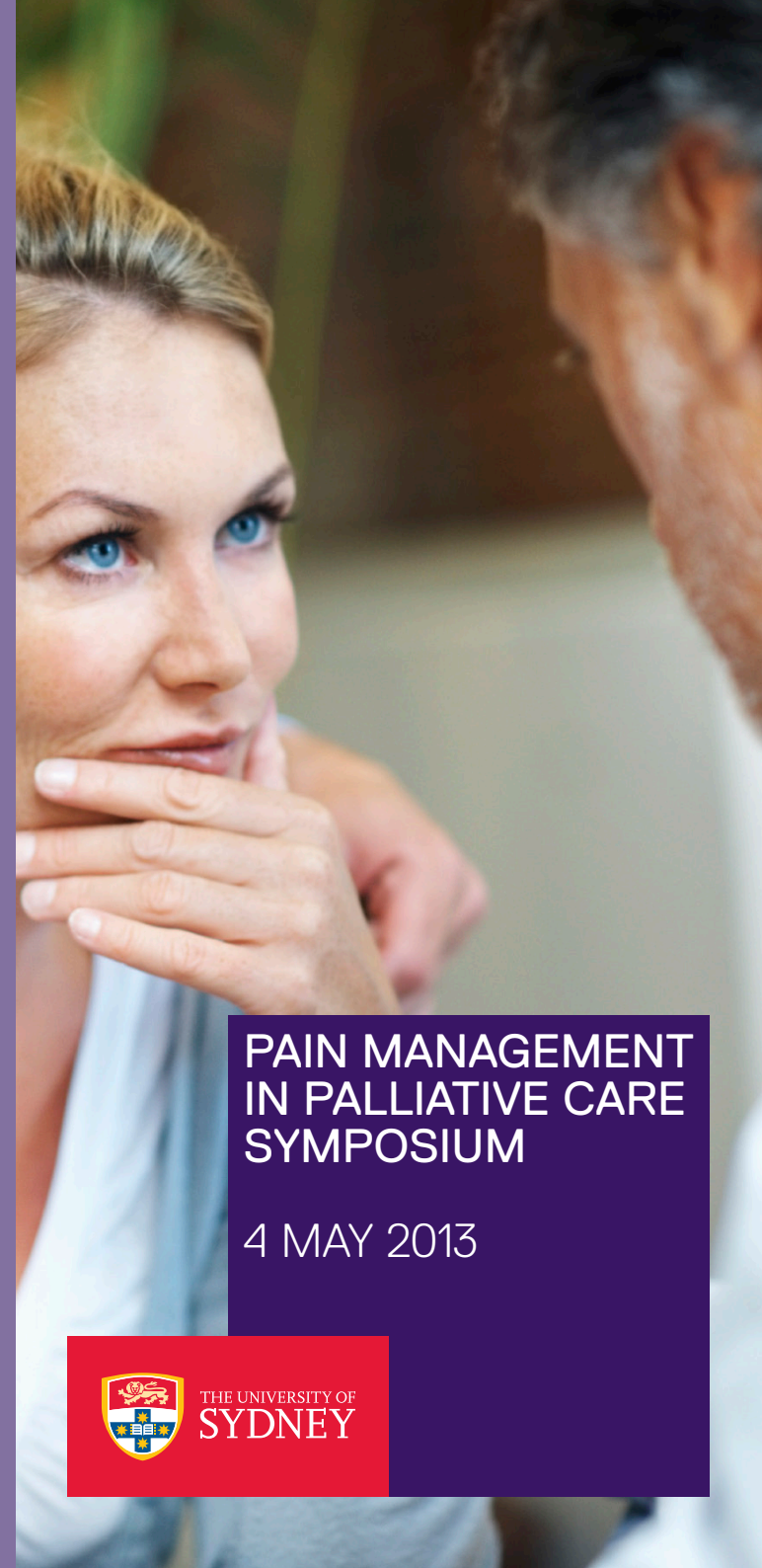
- Medical specialists in pain medicine, psychiatry, rheumatology, palliative care and orofacial medicine;
